Limes are **88%** water.






California harvests around **26,000 acres** of sweet corn each year.

Many areas throughout California grow sweet corn.

Sweet corn is typically in season from May - Sept.



Only **1%** of the corn grown in the U.S. is sweet corn.

All 50 states grow sweet corn – find some at your local farmers market!



Sweet corn is pollinated by the **wind**.

Sweet corn can be turned into syrup to be used as a sweetener.



Sweet corn is the ONLY corn grown for human consumption.

Each stalk produces 1 - 3 ears of corn.

85% of all carrots grown in the U.S. come from California.

Around **61,000 acres** of carrots are harvested in California each year.

Carrots are the second most popular vegetable in the world, after potatoes.

Carrots are **biennials**, which means they have a 2-year life cycle.



California is the **number 1** milk producing state in the U.S.

46% of California milk goes into making California cheese.

Holstein cows all have a unique pattern of spots!

1 cow produces around6 gallons of milk per day.

The reason milk is white is because it contains "casein" - a type of protein.

California is home to 1,100+ dairy farms.

Nearly **98%** of U.S. dairy farms are family owned & operated.

ALL 50 states have dairy farms!

The U.S. produces ~21 BILLION gallons of milk each year.

WHEREAS, these "School Nutrition Heroes" have prepped, warmed, packaged and served over 3 million meals throughout the School District since the pandemic, including 1.9 million alone in the City of Indio, via 18 school sites, including one apartment complex within the City, and

WHEREAS, they realize what they do daily is "more than a job." They do this because of their love for the students of Indio, understanding that for many of the families they serve, even outside of the pandemic, school provides the only meal they can count on, and

WHEREAS, the "Lunch Bunch" expanded their usual role from the confines of controlled environment of cafeterias to the extreme outdoor conditions of frigid desert cold and scorching desert heat. They have shown resilience and adaptability because they recognize the community is counting on them. They are focused entirely on providing nutritious meals to students, and have a unique understanding of the role hunger and lack of food plays in at-risk communities, and

WHEREAS, they now provide two grab-and-go meals a day, seven days a week, served twice a week to students, and sometimes entire families. They are thanked with photos, drawings, and overwhelmingly positive feedback. They take pride in providing a sense of normalcy to parents and students in our City and are rewarded with the smiles they receive from the students going through the drive-through line.
