



California produces nearly **90%** of all strawberries grown in the U.S.

Strawberries are grown on only **1%** of California's farmland.

One acre of land can produce **50,000** pounds of strawberries.

In California, strawberries are available **year-round**.

Main types of strawberries:

June-bearing, Ever-Bearing & Day-Neutral.

Strawberries are the **FIRST** fruit to ripen in the spring.

All strawberries are hand picked.



The average strawberry has **200** seeds.

Strawberries are the **ONLY** fruit with seeds on the outside.

Strawberries are a part of the **rose** family.

California grows **more** pluots than any other state in the U.S.


Pluots were developed in **California** in **1989** by **Floyd Zaiger**.

Pluots are a stone fruit.




Apricot

Pluots are around **25%** apricot and **75%** plum.



Pluots are in season from **May** - **September**.



Pluots come in a variety of colors – green, yellow, crimson, dappled, streaked or plum.

are harvested per **acre**.



46% of California milk goes into making California cheese.

Breeds of Dairy Cows:

- 6. Milking Shorthorn

Holstein cows all have a unique pattern of spots!

1 cow produces around6 gallons of milk per day.

The reason milk is white is because it contains "casein" - a type of protein.
