

New Hampshire produces 150,000+ gallons of maple syrup each year.

March is New Hampshire Maple Month!

Maple Sap Producing Trees:

1. Sugar Maple

2. Red Maple

3. Black Maple

A well cared for maple tree can live for up to **300 years!**

"Liquid Gold"



A single tree can produce up to **15 gallons** of sap per year.

New Hampshire is home to **90+ sugarhouses**.



A **sugarhouse** is where maple sap is taken to boil down into maple syrup.

3 types of maple syrup: Golden, Amber & Dark.



Amber maple syrup is the most common at the breakfast table.

40 gallons of maple sap= 1 gallon of maple syrup.

Maple sap is collected during **late winter** and **early spring**.

Potatoes

The **first white potato planted** in the U.S. was planted in New Hampshire.

New Hampshire's state vegetable is the white potato.

U.S. farmers
produce
around 4.5
million pounds
of potatoes
every hour.

In 1995, potatoes became the first vegetable grown in space!



Potatoes are the **second** most consumed food in the U.S.

35% of potatoes are turned into French fries.


Potatoes are also referred to as "spuds".
