

#### Pennsylvania

Apples

Pennsylvania is the **fourth largest** apple producing state in the U.S.



Pennsylvania produces **400-500 MILLION** pounds of apples per year.

Pennsylvania's apple season lasts from **mid July** -**November**.



apples make **1** gallon of cider. Pennsylvania has **21,000+ acres** of apple orchards.

2,500

varieties of apples are grown in the United States.

> The U.S. harvest **250 million bushels** of apples/year.



An **apple blossom** is the flower that comes from an apple tree.

An apple tree takes at least **4 years** to start producing fruit. Most apples are **HAND-PICKED.** 





Pennsylvania harvests around **20,000 acres** of barley a year.

6-Row barley is most common grown barley in Pennsylvania.

Barley is one of the **oldest** domesticated grain crops. A **small** percentage of barley is milled into flour.



Barley is used as a feed grain for livestock.

Barley is a cool-season, annual crop.

The head of the plant is called the **"barley spike"** which is made up of 20 - 60 grains.

Barley is a **tall grass** with a stem that reaches between 30 - 35 inches high.



Pennsylvania harvests around **1,000,000 acres** of corn every year!

Corn is grown in **EVERY** county in Pennsylvania.

Corn is America's number 1 field crop.

Corn is considered a **vegetable**, **fruit** AND a **grain!** 



Corn is the **most common** crop grown in Pennsylvania.

There are around **800** kernels on each ear of corn.

Most countries outside of the United States calls corn **"maize"**.

**90,000,000** acres of the earth are corn fields.



# Eggs

Pennsylvania is ranked **4<sup>th</sup>** in the U.S. for egg production.

#### Eat FARM FRESH eggs!

- Components of an Egg:
- 1. Eggshell
- 2. Egg White (Albumen)
- 3. Egg Yolk (Vitellus)

Eggs with **brown** shells come from **larger** hens.

One hen can lay around **250** eggs per year.

An eggs shell can have up to **17,000** pores - these pores allow moisture to pass through and keep bacteria out.

An eggs shell and yolk **color** do not affect the taste or quality of the egg.

Eggshells in stores are commonly **white** or **brown**, but they can also be **blue**, **green** or **pink**!



Breed of hen determines the shell color.

## ennsylvania Green Beans

Pennsylvania is home to over **9,000 acres** of green beans.

**Bush** & **pole** are the 2 main types of green beans.



Try growing green beans in your garden!

Green beans are the **3<sup>rd</sup> most** homegrown vegetable. Green beans are **the 2<sup>nd</sup> most common** vegetable grown in Pennsylvania.

#### 130+ varieties of green beans.

Green beans are also known as **"string beans"** or **"snap beans."** 



String beans can be **green**, **yellow** or **purple**!



Indiana is home to **465,000** dairy cows.

Pennsylvania produces around **10 BILLION** pounds of milk per year.

Nearly 98% of U.S. dairy farms are family owned & operated.



# Mushrooms

Pennsylvania produces around **500 MILLION pounds** of mushrooms each year.



Top 3 Mushroom Producing States:

Pennsylvania produces over **65%** of the U.S. mushroom crop.

Popular types of mushrooms: White Button, Crimino & Portabello.

**Umami** – a primary taste found in mushrooms.



Scientists have classified **2,189** mushrooms as **edible**.



These are all the **same** mushroom, just harvested at different ages.

Some mushrooms stay underground for **YEARS** waiting for the conditions to be just right to surface.

Did you know mushrooms are **not** considered a plant? They are a **FUNGUS**.



Fungi are the **LARGEST** life form on earth.

# Pennsylvania Oats

Pennsylvania harvests over **3 MILLION** bushels of oats each year.

Oats have been cultivated for **thousands** of years.



More than half of the world's oats are grown in the U.S. & Canada.

Classes of Wheat Grown in the U.S.

- 1. Hard Red Winter
- 2. Hard Red Spring
- 3. Soft Red Winter
- 4. Soft White
- 5. Durum



Hard Red Winter wheat is used mostly for making **breads**.

1 bushel of wheat contains around 100,000,000 individual kernels.

1 bushel of wheat can produce **90 loaves of bread**.


> 1 acre = **40** bushels of wheat.


Wheat grows best in **warm** weather.


The average wheat crop grows to be between **2 & 4 feet tall**.






